

The Next Steps



Frequently Ask Question

1. How long will the program run?

The program is designed to run from January to December. However, for this inaugural year, the timeline will be adjusted slightly due to the later launch.

2. Can adults apply?

Yes, adults are welcome to apply, but the program will primarily focus on youth and young adult ambassadors.

3. Is there any compensation for participants?

Ambassadors asked to travel for official visits or events will be considered for travel compensation.

4. Will there be in-person components to the program?

Yes, there will be opportunities to meet in person for fellowship, ministry events, and other activities.

5. Will there be leadership training beyond the outlined course?

Absolutely! In addition to the 4-week intensive, the program includes additional leadership topics and training throughout the year.

6. What happens after the year of training?

Graduated ambassadors may have opportunities to mentor the next cohort. They will also be encouraged to continue leading in their local contexts, growing into leaders who inspire and guide others.
